Organization (15 points)	1. The type of presentation is appropriate for the topic and audience.	5	
	2. Information is presented in a logical sequence.	5	
	3. Presentation appropriately cites requisite number of references.	5	
Content (45 points)	4. Introduction is attention-getting, lays out the problem well, and establishes a framework for the rest of the presentation.	5	
	5. Technical terms are well-defined in language appropriate for the target audience.	5	
	6. Presentation contains accurate information.	10	
	7. Material included is relevant to the overall message/purpose.	10	
	8. Appropriate amount of material is prepared, and points made reflect well their relative importance.	10	
	9. There is an obvious conclusion summarizing the presentation.	5	
Presentation (40 points)	10. Speaker maintains good eye contact with the audience and is appropriately animated (e.g., gestures, moving around, etc.).	5
