REQUIREMENTS OF THE HSE UNIVERSITY DISSERTATION COUNCIL FOR ASIAN AND AFRICAN STUDIES FOR PUBLICATIONS BY CANDIDATES FOR ACADEMIC DEGREES

Dissertation defences for Candidate of Sciences (PhD) degrees

When defending a standalone dissertation, the work should be accompanied by an attachment containing three articles (published in scientific journals included in HSE University Journals Lists A, B, C, or D). Individual monographs that have been published by HSE University List A^p publishing houses may be counted as journal articles for defence purposes.

One of the articles may have been written with a co-author, but only provided that the co-author does not serve as the candidate's academic supervisor or as a member of the dissertation defence committee.

Articles may be published in any language.

Dissertations by candidates for Candidate of Sciences (PhD) degrees presented in the form of scientific articles or monographs are not eligible for a defence.

Dissertation defences for Doctor of Sciences (DS) degrees

When defending a standalone dissertation, the work should be accompanied by an attachment containing 15 articles (published in scientific journals included in HSE University Journals Lists A, B, C, or D), of which at least five articles must be from journals in HSE University Journals Lists A or B (including at least one article from a List A journal). Individual monographs that have been published by HSE University List A^p publishing houses may be counted as List A journal articles for defence purposes.

No more than five of the attached articles may have been written with a co-author, but

only provided that the co-author(s) does/do not serve as the candidate's academic advisor or as a member of the dissertation defence committee.

Articles may be published in any language.

Dissertations by candidates for Doctor of Sciences (DS) degrees presented in the form of scientific articles or monographs are not eligible for a defence.
